L-3 Cincinnati Electronics Teams With United Launch Alliance to Launch the U.S. Air Force Space Command 6 (GSSAP) Mission

CINCINNATI, August 23, 2016 – L-3 Cincinnati Electronics (L-3 CE), a proud member of the Delta IV configuration rocket team, announced today that it participated in the successful United Launch Alliance (ULA) Delta IV launch in support of the Air Force Space Command 6 (AFSPC-6) mission. The Delta IV, equipped with L-3's avionics, was launched on August 19 from Space Launch Complex (SLC)-37 at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station, Florida.

The AFSPC-6 mission carried satellites for the Geosynchronous Space Situational Awareness Program (GSSAP) to identify and monitor potential threats in geosynchronous orbit for U.S. Strategic Command and to complete the Space Surveillance Network (SSN).

"Participating in the ULA launch to complete the SSN is very exciting for us," said Mark Dapore, L-3 CE's vice president and general manager of Space Electronics. "We are pleased to be part of the team supporting U.S. Strategic Command in its mission of providing the U.S. with situational awareness in space."

Included in the L-3 avionics for the mission were the launch vehicle's Tracking and Data Relay Satellite System (TDRSS) transmitter, as well as the safety command destruct receivers.

L-3 CE's expertise and performance in high-reliability telemetry, tracking and command (TT&C) and wideband data transmission to Earth ground stations demonstrate its leadership position in high-technology space electronics.
